March 28, 2019: Thursday - date of the **written entrance examination**

- Only candidates with complete application materials will be invited to attend

SYLLABI FOR THE WRITTEN ENTRANCE EXAMINATION:

ENGLISH LANGUAGE:

The entrance written exam in English tests the applicant's abilities in reading comprehension and his knowledge of grammar and lexis on the upper-intermediate level. The aim of the test is to verify that the applicant will be able to manage the demanding study of different subjects in English.

MATHEMATICS:

The test will cover material taught at primary school and also the first one and a half year of the Slovak grammar school curriculum:

Basic manipulation of algebraic expressions. Concept and notation of sets. Operations on sets: union and intersection. Prime numbers and factors. Definition of absolute value (modulus). Number systems: natural numbers, integers, rationals, irrationals and real numbers. Intervals. Definition of a function and its properties. Linear and quadratic functions, their graphs and properties. Solution of linear and quadratic equations and inequalities. Counting principle, permutations and combinations. Geometry of a plane. Geometrical transformations: translation, reflection, rotation, enlargement. Congruence and similarity. Definition of the functions: $\sin x$, $\cos x$, $\tan x$, their graphs and properties. Solving triangles including compound shapes.

The test will be available in English.

INFORMATION ON IBD STUDIES
INSTRUCTIONS TO SELECTION OF IBD SUBJECTS:

- in **group 1**, choose the language for a literature course for native or near – native speakers (normally your best language) and specify at its level
- in **groups 2 – 5**, choose **one subject**
- when both levels are offered, choose the desired level:
- HL = higher level, 5 hrs. weekly
- SL = standard level, 3 hrs. weekly
- (HL and SL differ in weekly time commitment, in depth and breadth of scope, sometimes also in content)
- Mathematics is classified in the Group **5**. If a student decides to take Computer Science, he/she may not have problems in Mathematics.
- a foreign language at SL **is not** for beginners
- in group **6**, choose 1 subject and its level
- **your selection must include 3 HL subjects and 3 SL subjects or 4 HL subjects and 2 SL subjects; your selection must include Mathematics**

Besides the subjects above, every students attends the following lessons and activities:

- **Extended Essay** – during your study, the student chooses one of the subjects above to produce an essay in total extent of 4000 words.
- **Writing** – learning the essentials of essay writing in English (2 lessons per week). Subject useful e.g. for subjects of Group 3 (individuals and societies) but also in applications for universities in UK or USA, which require so-called personal statement.
- **Theory of Knowledge** – subject studying how we know the things we know and what is it that we can know at all and with what reliability.
- **Creativity-Action-Service (CAS)** – subject crossing the borders of school work and extra-curricular activities. This includes all activities providing creative and physical development of students, such as science Olympiads and clubs, sport activities including the PE lessons and, most of all, the community service. This means various kinds of volunteering activities: tutoring young pupils (at our school, there is always someone to help), work for non-profit organizations (e.g. Slovak Red Cross), managing clubs and Olympiads for younger students, be it at our school or other schools (e.g. chess club or English club at school for visually handicapped persons). We will start in August with restoration of Banská Štiavnica Calvary – make sure you can join us on **26 August – 30 August 2019**. CAS – Service simply includes anything that fits into: I study mostly for myself but I'm here for others if they need me. *Try to imagine what you could/want to do for your CAS, especially its third part (Service) during your IBD studies and describe it at the bottom of the following page.*
